He then called the meeting to order and lead the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance and called for the roll.

**Special Thanks:** President Sharkey began by asking the board to stand and thanked them for all their hard work this past year. He then recognized Karla Richey for her work this past year. Howard recognized Walt Oller for his work on the website and gave him a token of appreciation. Howard asked the representatives of the bowling centers to stand, recognizing Dana Stanton, Steve Fuelling, Dan Voss and Mike Richey and thanked them for the team effort between the bowling centers and bowling association. We are very fortunate here in Rapid City, in that we all work great together. Thank you.

**Association Managers Report:** I reported that the membership is 1620, with 1400 adults and 220 youth, That 42 adults & 1 youth have rolled a 300 game. Twelve 800 series, and 25 games of 11 in a row. League High Game & Series are not necessary, but I request changes in league officers for 2017-18 season. The Youth Scholarship fundraiser is underway, any leagues that have not participated, please remember, it is not too late to help our youth and donations are appreciated. Going forward the 2017-18 Awards will be a pen and based on a Pins over Average program, along with 300, 800 & 11 in a row. I spoke on the state tournaments and the state bowling jamboree. The Rapid City Bowlers recognized at the Bowling Jamboree will be the John Sharkey family, Lois Ewert (posthumously) Hall of Fame in the Pioneer category and Drue Hutmacher the State Junior Ambassador.

**Election of Officer's & Directors:** President Howard Sharkey presented the name of Bill Ficken for the office of Vice President and called for nominations from the floor, with none Clint Dunker called for nominations to cease, this received a second, carried and Bill Ficken was re-elected as Vice President. President Sharkey then presented the names of Tony Pataky, Corie Martin & Mark Parker for the position of Director and called for nominations from the floor. With none, Tami Banning called for nominations to cease; this received a second and carried. Tony Pataky, Corie Martin & Mark Parker were elected to the Director position. President Sharkey then presented the names of Derek Patton & Tammara Geske for the position of Youth Director and called for nominations from the floor, with none Heidi Ayers called for nominations to cease, this received a second, carried and Derek & Tammara were elected as Youth Directors.

**Presidents Report:** Howard began by saying he realizes that it is 70\* outside and he appreciates all the members that took the time to attend the meeting. That he will keep this short, sweet and to the point. Our tournaments are heading in the right direction, with the Open up, Women's slightly down, Mystery Doubles & Super Brackets had good participation. The Dollar Qualifier was very positive, as was the Presidents Cup. However, he is most proud of the increases in the Youth Tournaments, with the Scholarship Tournament doubling in size, with 66 local youth participating. The Adult/Youth Tournament doubled in size and the Youth City presenting more than \$900 in scholarship funds. Howard spoke on the changes made to lower the costs for our youth events and to make the tournaments fun. We know we have more work to do, but things are going the right direction.

**Audit & Finance:** Heidi Ayers reported that she has audited the books and everything is in order.

**Charities:** Corie Martin reported the BVL fundraiser was in November during league and funds requested to benefit the Veteran Administrations at Hot Springs and Ft Meade. The fundraiser for Bowl for the Cure was during the Women's and Open City Tournaments and these funds requested for the Komen Foundation of South Dakota.

**Publicity:** Jason Szymanski reported that nothing was new at this time.

**Youth Committee:** Gene Carsten reported that the Youth Awards program will be April 22<sup>nd</sup>, Noon at Meadowood.

**High School Senior Scholarship:** Howard reported that the Senior Scholarship applications were mailed to all High School Seniors, with a return date of April 1. The scholarships recipients will be announced at the Youth Awards program on April 22<sup>nd</sup>.

**Awards & Recognition:** Tim Ayers reported the Awards & Recognition committee placed nomination forms for the Rapid City Hall of Fame in all bowling centers earlier in the year. Hall of Fame nominees will receive a Hall of Fame application in the near future and if anyone has suggestions of people, that deserve recognition, and overlooked, please contact Tim Ayers or Howard Sharkey.
